ITU-APT Foundation calls upon Asian governments to release more Wi-Fi and unlicensed spectrum to support global fight against COVID-19

Responding to the increased demand for Working and studying from home due to COVID-19, ITU-APT Foundation of India today called upon Asian countries to delicense 6 GHz (5.925-7.125 GHz), 60 GHz (57-66 GHz) and 70 GHz (66 –71 GHz) bands on priority while making sure that there is adequate protection to the satellites and the fixed links that currently use these frequency bands.

Speaking at a global webinar on "COVID-19: the spectrum policy response" organized by Policy Tracker, Mr Bharat Bhatia, President of the ITU-APT Foundation of India, India's ITU association, said that maximum connectivity during the COVID-19 lockdown is primarily required at homes and the existing wireless networks were not designed to handle this kind of load from residential areas. Backhaul and last mile connectivity for such a situation needs extensive support from the government in terms of policy and redesigning the regulatory framework, which is straining the 3G/4G/5G cellular mobile networks and also slowing down the home Wi-Fi networks due to limited spectrum for backhaul and last mile.
