ISMC-22: IAFI successfully organised the 2nd India Spectrum Management Conference organised by ITU-APT Foundation of India (IAFI) on the 6th & 7th December 2022 covering new spectrum strategy for 5G expansion, digital divide, connecting the unconnected and providing impetus to local manufacturing and innovation in India. Honourable Minister of State for Communications of India [Shri. Devusinh Chauhan was the Chief Guest](#) of the event. He said that the “high-speed roll out of 5G across all sectors will be the key to reducing the digital divide leaving no man behind”. Telecom Stories:

The Department of Telecommunications (DoT) is likely to unveil a revised draft of the telecommunications bill in less than a month, to address issues raised by the ministry of information and broadcasting and others around regulating content of over-the-top (OTT) apps and broadcasting services such as direct-to-home (DTH). In the revised telecom bill draft, will clearly state that its aim is to regulate only communication apps that give the same services as telecom operators. This will remove any ambiguity around the category of apps that DoT will regulate.



Dr. Jitendra Singh Union Minister of State Science & Technology; Minister of State Earth Sciences; MoS, Personal, Public Grievances, Pensions Atomic Energy and Space expressed his views on proposing to the government to widen the participation of private players in space domain, by allowing them to undertake end-to-end space activities. He also added by saying that the department of space is in the process of formulating a comprehensive, overarching space policy, that shall bring clarity on roles of various stakeholders.



The government plans to run extensive cybersecurity workshops for key officials of public sector units as well as other government departments. The workshop by the IT ministry comes following a crippling cyberattack on the servers of the state-run All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) These workshops, to be conducted by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) from December 19, will cover aspects such as darknet and dark web, D-DOS attack and service disruption, advanced persistent threats and common attacks techniques adopted by cybercriminals.
